Sonic drilling reveals 80 million year old fern leaf

Drillers from Vancouver-based [Sonic Drilling Ltd.](#) were amazed to discover a fossilized fern leaf in a recent core sample taken on a project in Tumbler Ridge, BC, Canada. The company had been contracted to drill to 160 ft., provide core samples and assist with soil penetration testing every five feet.

"The drillers just arbitrarily picked up a piece of the core sample and found the leaf inside," says Bill Fitzgerald, general manager of Sonic Drilling Ltd. "It was pretty exciting to see something that old."

The engineer on site estimated the leaf to be approximately 80 million years old. It was cored at 160 feet below the surface and imbedded in coal.

Sonic drill rigs are often used on projects like this due to their ability to provide undisturbed, continuous core samples to 300 ft. and beyond.
